ExamSoft is an exam management tool. It is specifically designed to help Nursing schools improve student learning with insight from valuable data, a

better way to track student learning and report programmatic performance to the CCNE and extensive reports that can immediately identify risks and remediate students before it's too late.

This software enables secure testing on student computers by blocking access to programs, files and Internet usage during the test. This faculty training module covers the foundations, how to structure questions, develop assessments and delivery, and how to report data in ExamSoft
